Revd Mary writes -

My dear Friends,

Another week, another announcement from the Prime Minister, this time outlining the easing of lockdown restrictions.

This easing will open up life for some of us, whilst others amongst us will continue to shield - and for an extended period. I know we'll continue to be sensitive towards those who haven't experienced the announcement as good news.

For us, as a church community, there were two significant strands. The first, that we can once again host weddings - albeit with restricted numbers and with a stripped-back service. The second, that we can once again worship together in our buildings. Both of these will be possible from 4th July.

On the face of it, this permission to gather in our buildings for worship simply sounds like great news. We love to worship together - and soon we can again.

Look just beneath the surface, though, and the complexity quickly emerges.

What will our fellowship with one another feel like if we are socially distanced from one another in church, as we must be?

How would we feel about being in church when so many of our church family would be absent because it is not safe for them to be there, or they don't feel confident to do so?

What about our brothers and sisters who have formed part of our online worshipping community? How can we stay connected to them?

How will we experience our worship when we cannot sing together, and may not be able to have communion together?

What about our village churches? Will we continue to worship as a team even when we worship in a building?

And would it even be possible to 'staff' our old service pattern, given that some of our ministers won't be available to lead worship?

Each of these questions - and many others - will need careful consideration, judicious weighing up, and prayerful reflection. This will all take time, not least because we are still awaiting detailed guidance from the Government, the Church of England and the diocese. This may well not be available until sometime next week.

Because this will need to be a 'slow-cooked' decision, and because the information we will need is not available yet, I am still going to take my planned leave which starts this Sunday morning (28th June) and continues until Friday 3rd July. You can imagine that this is much-needed - and will hopefully give me a clearer head on my return when we will start thinking through these sensitive and important issues in earnest.

The survey will only take about five minutes to complete, and is our way of listening to you about your thoughts and feelings on the potential of returning to church for public worship. It would be really helpful if you would fill this in (the answers will come to me anonymised) AND if you would help anyone not on the internet to add their voice to the discussion by talking them through the questions and completing the survey on their behalf, too.

So - pleased be assured that when we have received the guidance, and when I am back from leave, we will begin exploring this most important issue carefully. In the meantime, please be assured, as ever, of my love and prayers.

And now - to the tent (in my back garden!) for my holiday from home. (Freya is confused!)

Night Prayer

As I explained in last week's letter, our pattern of Night Prayer is changing this weekend. We will continue to share Night Prayer online on Monday-Friday evenings at 9pm. Join us live on our Facebook page, or catch up later on our website, sthelensashby.net.

On Saturday and Sunday evenings, the new invitation is for each of us to pray Compline at home, using one of the orders of service we have prayed with during lockdown. You might like to say Compline at 9pm, mindful of others who are doing the same.

The readings for this weekend are:

Saturday: Psalm 66, Job 25-26, Romans 11.13-24

Sunday: Psalm 50; 1 Samuel 28.3-19, Luke 17.20-end

You might like to choose just one of these and spend your time reading and re-reading it to let its words sink in.

You might find it helpful to light a candle to create a 'sacred space' in your living room or at your kitchen table. Music helps some people to focus, to breathe deeply, to form a point of transition from what has been preoccupying them to a time when they are more conscious of God's presence.

I really encourage you to have a go at praying Compline by yourself - and I would love to hear how you get on! What an opportunity this is to develop sustaining patterns of personal prayer for the long-term.
