

# Notices for 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2020

#### **Dear Friends**

It is inevitable, I think, that our worlds have shrunk during this pandemic. We've become aware, more sharply than ever before, perhaps, of our own mortality and we've acted, just as we've needed to do, for our own protection. However misguided, that was what the muchmaligned stock-piling was about right at the beginning, I think: this visceral instinct to look after our own; to survive.

Even if we haven't stock-piled, this call to self-preservation has meant that we've all become more inwardlooking. Mum and I have found that this has manifested itself in an avid interest in our meals: in what we're going to eat and when. Others have told me that interpersonal spats which would be trivial in 'normal' times - have taken on a greater intensity, with all that spare time for licking of wounds. I'm not criticising us for this introspection - I think perhaps its inevitable in these times in which we live. Yet it's not first and foremost what we're called to as we follow Jesus Christ who looked, not to his own interests, but to the good of others.

The terrible tragedy in Beirut has shocked us out of this centring on the self, I think; it has blown wide open the defences we have built so carefully around ourselves and demanded that we look at the suffering of others. There is a world beyond the little world you live in, the disaster has insisted; there are many more people beyond this small bubble in which you live.

What are we to do with such rediscovered awareness. I wonder? Some of us might be able to give to the Red Cross appeal for those who are enduring unimaginable trauma in Lebanon. For them, we can also stockpile prayers. Or perhaps we could adopt a spiritual discipline so that, having paid proper attention to how we're feeling, to our needs, we might also pray for others whose needs are like ours but are magnified, more intense. And perhaps, with some more free time on our hands than we would normally have, we could ask God to show us an issue where we could make a difference through practical action or by joining a campaign. Liz Smith and her friends have been a brilliant example to us in this, in their walk and run for those who are homeless.

Our worlds have shrunk just now, but there is still a great world beyond us, full of our brothers and sisters. Can we lift our eyes from our own circumstances, to them, little-by-little, more and more?
