Dear Friends

As things continue to ease a little, at least for now; it seems a good moment for reflection; an opportunity to decide, both as individuals and as a church what to pick up again, and what to leave behind.

One of the gifts of the pause Covid-19 has enforced on us is this opportunity to look at our life together afresh, to really see it, rather than just continuing with what we've always done because – well, we've always done it.

Specifically, I have four questions in mind that I'd like us to reflect on:

- what were we doing before Covid-19 that we'd like to pick up again?
- what were we doing before Covid-19 that we'd like to leave behind?
- what have we done during the pandemic that we'd like to continue once its threat is over?
- what have we done during the pandemic that we'd like to leave behind once we are back to 'normal'?

Pausing to reflect on these questions now will mean that when we are able to live less restricted lives, we can live intentionally, putting our energies to what we have seen is at the heart of our calling for us in the post-pandemic world. I am hoping that each of the churches in our Flagstaff Family might use their Annual Meetings, scheduled for October, to reflect on these questions together. In preparation, why not talk to one another about them, pray to God about them?

In a powerful verse in Isaiah, God says to his people, who have been in exile, 'forget the former things, do not dwell on the past. See! I am doing a new thing' (43.18).

Covid-19 has been, to us, an exile of sorts. As we look towards our return to our homeland, what is God asking us to leave behind, and what new thing is he doing amongst us?

Let's use the gift of this time well to pause, to reflect, to hear God's new call to us
