Psalm 13 begins with the psalmist addressing God on four fronts with the same anguish ridden question: How long O Lord?

I wonder how many times God has been asked the same question during this year?

Now, I would reiterate that there is nothing wrong in asking that question, it is perfectly valid and a privilege that God has given us through relationship with him, lament is a legitimate reaction, one that God will not turn his ear from.

As I write to you this day, the briefing from the Chief scientist and medical officer is being digested by our news agencies.

The underlying feeling from different aspects of our society and indeed the world is; How long?

It has been a very challenging time, since the pandemic started to hit the headlines we have had so many changes implemented around us. Moreover just when it seems that we have adapted to the latest guidance the situation changes again. This can of course be frustrating and worrying amongst other feelings.

As the Flagstaff team I think we have responded positively to the many challenges we have had. No, we probably have not got everything right but we have had a prayerful approach to our various responses, always trying to balance guidance, legislation and pastoral needs. Indeed copious risk assessments have been written, reviewed and implemented in order to ensure that we are acting with the upmost responsibility to people's safety.

We have seen St Helen's open for private prayer on Saturdays. Evening prayer and in some places communion services have also been held or due to be held soon. Although this has been very different it has complemented the online presence that has been maintained throughout the pandemic. Even a look through he news sheet reveals that we are very much active and will continue to be in whatever form we can be.

However, in the anticipation of new and more restrictive Government announcements the forms that activity takes may need to re-evaluated.

Yet in the midst of this, we can return to Psalm 13 and remember the message of verse 5 that: 'I have trusted in your steadfast love; my heart shall rejoice in your salvation.'

So whatever the twists and turns this year continues to produce we can be confident of a certainty: The **steadfast** love of God. A quick glance at my Oxford dictionary tells me God's love is Constant, Firm and Unwavering. We may still be living in uncertain times but there are still certainties that we can be assured of, the steadfast love of the Lord is one of those. Yours in Christ, Stewart

This app launched on Thursday and is designed to help the NHS contact those who have been in close proximity to someone infected with Covid-19. To support the NHS in this way we simply need to:

 download the app to our smart phones

• on entering a shop, pub, cafe, bus, train or church, scan the NHS QR code to register that you are in that building

• if anyone else at that venue at the same date and time subsequently reports a positive Covid-19 test, the app will automatically contact you and advise you of any action you need to take.
