Foundations are important, when I lived in Scotland I learned a little about building retaining walls from a dear friend, who said something like; 'the more the wall will go up, the deeper you have to dig down first.' we must have shifted tonnes of earth building this wall over some weeks but it was finally finished and still stands today, sadly my friend died 10 years ago of a heart attack aged 46.

As we dug we often talked about that bible passage and how important it is as Christians to keep building on the rock of Christ.

I know over the past year many of you have had foundation shaking experiences on top of all the upheaval

that we are all experiencing.

That is often why it is so important to tend the roots or foundations of our faith.

Lent is always an apt time to examine ourselves and see where we are building in life and check the foundations are right. This of course goes for us all as individuals but also as churches, God's gathered people. I don't mean that we need to go looking at the foundations of our buildings, but to check that our hopes for the future are aligned to God's desires for His church.

One of the ways we can be sure of our foundations is through prayer. Prayer is a vital part of growing our relationship with God. It is also a way of upholding those around us who are facing tough times. I know many of you are great for praying with and for others and let me encourage that, it so uplifting for people to know that they are being prayed for, even if they can't quite pray about things themselves.
