Notices for 11th April 2021

Dear Friends

On Monday, the Prime Minister announced that the country would proceed with Stage 2 of the road-map out of Covid-19 restrictions. Stage 2, as you know, means the opening up of non-essential retail, hairdressers (hooray!) and outdoor hospitality (cheers!).

Our PCCs have also decided that Stage 2 will mean a return to worship in our church buildings, for those who feel able to do so.

Let me emphasise, right at the beginning of this letter, that we will continue to live-stream worship from St Helen's so that those who cannot be with us in person remain a full and honoured part of our worshiping community. For me, this has been one of the gifts of the pandemic: to realise (and why didn't we before?) that we can offer streamed worship to people in their own homes. We may, in time, need to work out how to do this in a less 'Heath Robinson' way, but our commitment to do so is for the long-term.

Our first Sunday back in any of our buildings will be 18th April, when we will resume the 10.30am/ 4.00pm pattern we followed last time we were able to be in church. This will be a 'holding pattern' over the summer, with a view to introducing something more permanent in the autumn. There are several reasons for not defaulting to our pre-pandemic service pattern now:

1. We do not have the same number of ministers available to us now as we did pre-pandemic. David Watson very sadly has died, John Dawson has moved away, and another of our ministers is continuing to shield due to her vulnerability to the virus.

2. We do not know how much longer we will have Stewart Betts with us, as he is coming to the end of his curacy, and beginning to look for parishes of his own.

3. Over the summer, our hard-working ministers, lay and ordained, will want to take holidays, and to catch up with family members they haven't seen for months. I am encouraging them to do that as a priority.

4. Many congregation members will be away too so it makes sense to not offer too many services.

So, for now, our monthly pattern will be:

1st Sunday: 10.30am St Helens (although this may continue exclusively online, at least for now)

4.00pm Isley Walton 2nd Sunday: 10.30am St Helen's, 4.00pm Coleorton

3rd Sunday: 10.30 am St Helen's, 4.00pm Staunton Harold

4th Sunday: 10.30am St Helen's, 4.00pm Breedon

Please note that both Isley Walton and Staunton Harold have building works which means that we cannot hold physical services there

yet. Staunton Harold's first service is therefore likely to be 16th May, and Isley Walton's 6th June.

You can be assured that rigorous social distancing measures will be in place in all of our buildings, and that worshipers will be asked to wear masks and to sanitise their hands. And there's a really good development - whilst we can't sing as a congregation indoors - we can sing outdoors and when the weather is in our favour we'll sing our final hymn outside!

Culture Recovery Grant: success!

St Helen's Church has been awarded a grant of £21,000 from the Government's £1.57 billion Culture Recovery Fund to help us reopen our heritage activities in a Covid safe way. Our grant is part of nearly £400 million that has been awarded to thousands of cultural organisations across the country.

Online heritage activities have continued through the pandemic. Plans are being made to restart inperson events in a safe way once that is permitted. The grant will boost these plans in significant ways, including the following:

◆ Additional staff time to prepare both buildings to be used safely

 Professional fees for local heritage professionals to design and deliver events

• Equipment and learning materials, plus publicity and promotion costs

 ◆ Training for volunteers to deliver Covid safe events

26th June: Responses to Living in Love and Faith

We hope to meet in person for this Saturday session, outdoors if possible, to share our responses on the course and to offer feedback, as requested to the House of Bishops

These dates are deliberately spread out to allow us reading and reflection time in between each session. Please let Revd Mary know if you'd like to join in with these sessions, as there will be some pre-reading for us to share with you, and a Zoom link to send out.
