Christmas gifts for asylum seeker children please!

This year, we are again asking for donated gifts for children who are housed In Loughborough while their parents' claim for asylum is being processed. Gifts to the value of no more that £10 would be much appreciated. This year, we would like new items only please and they do NOT need to be wrapped. A collection box will be provided in church. Your generosity last year was SO MUCH appreciated!!

Asylum seekers' children are housed and adequately fed, but parents are then

allocated £9:95 per week per child to cover all other essentials including shoes and clothes, so that doesn't allow much for 'treats'!

The breakdown of ages and genders is as follows:

Newborns: 11 (Male 5, Female 6)

Ages 1–6: 18 (M- 8, F- 10) Ages 7–12: 6 (M- 3 , F- 3) Ages 13–17: 10 (M-6 , F- 4)
